Friday afternoon the camp and vehicles were cleaned up. Most of the group headed for home with the satisfaction that they had helped get these homes nearer to completion and that they had served the Lord and had fun doing it. A few of the group were determined to finish the drywall in Ms. Ruth's house and returned there to work for a few hours.

FAR ROCKAWAY, NEW YORK

Disaster: 2012 Hurricane Sandy

We had 12 volunteers from Winnipeg, MB, working at the project this week. At Miss Stella's house the garage door was removed and replaced to include an egress door, drywall was hung in the boiler room, an exhaust fan was installed in bathroom and a new door was installed in the boiler room. New doors were hung in the utility room at Miss Joan's home, exterior doors were painted, tile was grouted in the bathroom and some doors were adjusted. Miss Joan came to dinner on Wednesday evening and shared her story with us. At Miss Marcia's the drywalling, from hanging to final sanding, was accomplished in spite of some challenging situations.

MINOT, NORTH DAKOTA

Disaster: 2011 Floods

We were blessed to have five volunteers from PA staying for a second week, so they knew the projects well and could jump right in on Monday morning. John, who is a plumber/electrician, was sent from one site to another to do any of the jobs that required his expertise. Amos, who is a contractor, was also sent to various locations every day. Frank and Todd took on the work at Ms. Gabrielle's house, which they completed and so we are ready to dedicate that house next week. Gerry and Rich were assigned Ms. Olivia's project which they completed by the end of the week, much to Ms. Olivia's delight. Walter and Jay continued working on Ms. Carol's deck along with the help of various others. On Wednesday night we invited Ms. Carolyn and her daughter to join us for supper, after which they shared their story of struggles and regained hope and faith. You could sense their joy in the Lord as they spoke. What a time of blessing we enjoyed as we then dedicated their house the following day!

STATEN ISLAND, NEW YORK

Disaster: 2012 Hurricane Sandy

This week our most interesting job was repairing a house with a floor that sloped 10 inches from the front door to the back door! Our volunteers were up for the challenge. We dropped the floor two inches from the front door to the back of the living room. We were then going to slope the hallway three inches to the kitchen (exactly like it was before) but our client preferred a step. The kitchen and dining room are level and then we raised the back door two inches. By Friday afternoon, we had jacked walls, torn out flooring and floor joists, installed new floor joists, insulated and put down the new sub-floor and we gained our 10 inches. All this was done with the client living upstairs!

Volunteers Angela and Rose spent hours at the saw cutting short pieces of wood for bunk bed parts while three-year-old Trudy and four-year-old Wyatt placed many of those pieces into neat stacks to be used by the assembly crew. It was amazing to see how efficient the assembly crew was at putting the wood into jigs and screwing them together. Throughout the project the staff of Camp Evergreen was very accommodating and often expressed appreciation for the work that was being accomplished by the MDS group.
