TORNADO CLEAN UP CONTINUES

TORNADO CLEAN UP CONTINUES

Clean up continues in Winston County, MS, after it was hit by an EF4 tornado on Apr. 28. MDS has volunteers from PA and IN in the area this week. They are operating nine pieces of heavy equipment, seven skid steers and two track hoes, removing debris, downed trees and clearing the remains of totally destroyed homes to the curb. In Louisville, a town of 10,000 residents, more than 330 houses were completely destroyed and 160 houses suffered major damage.

MDS volunteers have contributed over 3,600 volunteer hours since the response began. Larry Stoner, Disaster Response Coordinator, expects the cleanup phase to continue several more weeks. Stoner noted the need for volunteers with skills to operate heavy equipment. MDS leaders are working with the local long-term recovery committee to determine the possibility of a rebuilding response.

HIGH RIVER, ALBERTA Disaster: 2013 Flood

Along with our repair work this week, our volunteers participated in the Community Clean-up day, sponsored by one of our partner agencies, Samaritan's Purse. The students headed out with gusto, wearing their bright blue MDS t-shirts, ready to "get out of the basement" and soak up some vitamin D. Their enthusiasm was well noted when they received the "Gold Shovel" award for the most creative video and photos of their team working. Tears were shed by the three different homeowners whose yards they restored to beauty once again.

Numerous opportunities arise for interaction with family members staying here at the Saddlebrook community, especially when we cross paths in the dining hall. One little fellow in particular likes to sit at the table while we eat, calling us each by name. The young boys especially love it when the college students kick the soccer ball around with them in the evenings.

JAMESTOWN, COLORADO Disaster: 2013 Flood

In Sept. 2013 Jamestown received its total annual rainfall in a matter of 48 hours. Roads were washed out and buildings destroyed by flooding and mud coming from the rising waters of James Creek and Little Jim Creek that run right through the town. Many residents were evacuated by helicopter. The highway and road into town were compromised in many areas.

MDS is partnering with Flatirons Habitat for Humanity to help get this small town rebuilt. Volunteers will be housed at the Jefferson Elementary School over the summer. MDS brought in a shower trailer which sits on the school playground. The long-term volunteers will be staying in a home downtown that survived most of the flooding. The first weekly volunteers arrive and will begin work the week of June 9-13.
