After a life-changing experience in 2005 serving those suffering from the devastating effects of Hurricane Katrina in our nation's south east, Rick began his non-profit career.

Since then, his service includes working with the blind and vision impaired, working with women experiencing homelessness and/or a crisis pregnancy, three years serving Christians in the Middle East and North Africa who are experiencing unimaginable religious persecution, and currently working to restore women from the horrors of sex trafficking right here in Lancaster County.

North Star Initiative is a local non-profit ministry with the vision to restore women from trafficking. for freedom. for life. forever. Its mission is to provide support to woman who are survivors of sex trafficking and sexual exploitation by addressing their physical, emotional and spiritual needs through a Christ-centered focus.
