The following update on Stephen Gascho from his sister Jessica Gascho was sent via email on Wednesday. Dear Witmer Heights Family,

I wanted to update you all on Stefan's surger on Tuesday, June 25. Thank you all so much for your love, prayers and support.

Stefan did well during the surgery. This was somewhat of a concern because of his weakened heart. The fact that he is awake, sitting up and talking is something we are all very grateful for!

The surgeon was able to get 95% of the tumor in his right lung. He could not get it all because some implants of tumor are on his diaphragm as well as the pleura (the tissue lining the lungs and the lung cavity). He was able to remove the bulk of the tumor.

This means that Stefan's cancer cannot be 'cured' surgically. The next likely steps are a genetic/immunotherapeutic drug to target a specific genetic mutation, and/or radiation therapy.

We were hoping that the tumor could have been completely removed, so there is some sadness and disappointment with this outcome, but we are overwhelmingly grateful for Stefan's life.
